CELEBRATING A LEGACY: SJBHS TURNS 160

It is our privilege to bring to you this edition of **The Josephite** which has much to celebrate: SJBHS turns 160 and its alumni association, the illustrious Old Boys Association is 100 years old. On the occasion of the institution's 160th birthday, **Shashank M** and **Shagun Bopaiah** of 12 C interviewed **Principal Rev Fr Clifford Sequeira SJ** about the school's long history and the way forward.

JESUIT INSTITUTIONS ARE SOME OF THE OLDEST IN THE WORLD AND CONTINUE TO BE POPULAR EVEN TODAY. ST JOSEPH'S BOYS' HIGH SCHOOL, CELEBRATING ITS 160^{TH} YEAR, IS PROOF OF THIS FAITH IN JESUIT EDUCATION.

St Ignatius, founder of the Jesuit order realised that education had a far reaching influence in bringing about social and moral change. Today, 400 years later, education continues to be one of the important ministries of the Jesuits. From its very inception, this school has engaged in the mission of educating students from every social background; providing opportunities for their holistic development. The singular objective of this institution is to impart integral education to form men and women for others, for the transformation of society.

THE LANDMARK EVENTS IN THE PAST TEN YEARS.

Ten years ago, the school celebrated 150 years of its glorious existence. With the decision to introduce classes right from Kindergarten and the reintroduction of the ISC, St. Joseph's has become a complete school once again. In 2007, SJBHS became a co-educational school, and opened admission to girls in standard 11. Five years ago, an additional section was added to meet the huge demand for admissions. In order to ensure that the glorious sporting tradition of St. Joseph's remains intact, a new state-of-the-art sports complex was inaugurated in the year 2015.

The past few years have seen several changes in the school in keeping with rapid changes in society. We have prioritised innovative practices and technology, infrastructural developments, introduction of new clubs, sporting facilities and so on. Outreach programmes, where our staff and students have worked together with sister institutions in north Karnataka have also been a big success. SJBHS marked its 160th year of existence by staging a Broadway musical, 'Billy Elliot'.

THE FORMATION OF THE OBA.


Although the school is 160 years, it was only after the first world war when Josephites served in the armed forces that galvanised a sense of belonging in Old Boys and helped to constitute an enduring Old Boys Association in its aftermath.

WHAT BRINGS AN OLD BOY BACK?

There are different motivations for different old boys. Let's take my own experience. When I left the school in 1968, there were other priorities which were important to me, like completing college, getting a job and so on. At that time I was not drawn as much to the school as I am drawn today when I want to give back. I find this common in many of the Old Boys. People have a strong connect later. The desire to return can vary. In my case, I have two children – both are boys and both of them eventually came to school and therefore I reconnected with the school. In the case of many of my friends, their connection is not as concrete with the school. Their connection is with their batchmates. Looking now at what makes people come back to school, in the last say three to four years we've had multiple events. All these strengthen the camaraderie and build bonds.

FOND MEMORIES OF SCHOOL.

In our time we had the Cottonion Shield. And in those days the Cottonion Shield tournament was not limited by the number of overs. It just went on and on, for over three days. Similarly, we had an excellent hockey team that won the Centenary shield. Sporting events bring back memories. It also was the time when the moon landing happened. That was big deal in school. I think the OBA members today have learnt that all round development is crucial and some of our best memories have been outside the classroom.

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN THE OBA OVER THE PAST TEN YEARS.

We have started using technology in a way that leaves us in awe. For example, in the old days everyone had to come to the OBA office to pay, buy tickets so on. Now we have online payments and credit card machine in the office. We have started using social media: We have a Facebook page, an Instagram account and Whatsapp. All of these things make sending messages a lot easier. We also have started reaching out to many more Old Boys. We have a database that allows us to reach out to more people. We use SMS to communicate.

MESSAGE FOR A NEW GENERATION OF JOSEPHITES.

We are basically torchbearers. We run a leg of a long race. It is a marathon. Hundred years are over. We look forward to the next hundred years. We hope that all the values and camaraderie only get stronger over time. We hope that we can get younger talent to join us – stronger legs to run the race.
